## **MCAULEY GLOBAL ISSUES CLASS EXHIBITS NEIGHBORHOOD DIVERSITY PROJECT**

Mother McAuley Social Science teacher Mr. Oliver McSurley challenged his Geography and Global Issues students to investigate the diversity within the McAuley community. Each student was assigned a Chicago neighborhood and asked to produce a cutout of the community. The class used the cutouts to construct a wall map depicting all of the neighborhoods in Chicago and asked the students, faculty and staff to place a sticker on the community they are from. The map, which is on display in McAuley's main hallway, is a visual indicator and reminder of the diverse communities from which we all come.
